In this book, the idea of diagramming sentences has been expanded to include diagramming complex sentences. There are more examples and better visuals to explain the ideas involved. It evaluates the compound-complex sentence. Compound-complex sentence consists of at least one independent clause and one or more dependent clauses. It also discusses the sentences according to function. According to function, there are declarative sentence, interrogative sentence, imperative sentence and exclamatory sentence. It examines the elements of sentence. They are subject, verb, object, complement and adverbial. In every good sentence, the subject and verb are compulsory while other elements are optional. It highlights the patterns of sentence. A pattern differs from another because there are changes in the sentence elements, especially the object, complement or adverbial. It shows how to employ parallelism in the construction of sentences. Parallelism is the state of having similar nouns, phrases and clauses in a sentence. And it contains many crucial questions designed to enable you master how to make correct sentences.
